

Subject: Army National Guard (ARNG) Overview

Top-Line Message: The ARNG, with a projected end strength of 342,000 Soldiers in FY16, is the largest reserve force in the Department of Defense. ARNG units and personnel are organized, administered, armed, equipped, and trained to federal Army standards.
